## RULES AND REGULATIONS:

1. Phone entries will not be accepted in this department.
2. An exhibitor may make two entries under one lot number. However, entries must be made from different recipes.
3. PIES should be in an aluminum pie tin and not covered.
4. CAKES should be on a disposable plate and not covered. No frosting on cut side of cake.
5. OTHER BAKED ITEMS should be on a disposable plate and placed in a self-closing bag (no twist ties).
6. CANNED FOODS a] Must be processed according to USDA recommendations. All canned items must be canned in clear glass standard pint, quart or jelly jars with new self-sealing lids. Paraffin is not permitted on jams and jellies. b) All canned items must have been processed within the last year. c] Entries will be disqualified if: 1) Jars are unsealed. 2) Rust is present on rings and/or flats. 3) Deterioration is present [off-color, breakdown of product, etc.].
7. Attach exhibitor tag to the entry by punching a hole in the plate or pie tin and tying the tag to the plate or tin.
8. If above rules aren't followed, entry will be marked down one grade.
9. No jars will be opened for judging.
10. The Madison County Fair Association, superintendents and assistants are not responsible for loss or damage of any exhibit.
